How to Enter

Entry into the College Awards is divided into two phases.

PHASE 1 Number of students registered for college courses. This information must be returned by 15th April 2011, together with a printout from your awarding body confirming your registrations.

PHASE 2 Number of students who have obtained their qualification. This will be required on a separate form to be issued to you in May, again supported by documentation from your awarding body confirming your pass rate.

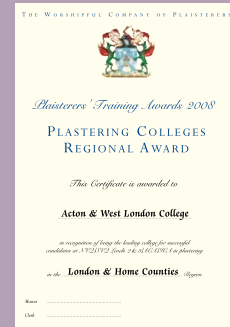

- The percentage number of students achieving NVQ/SVQ Levels 2 and 3/ ACA/ICA/Diploma/PDA (applicable to Scotland only) combined during the period September 2010-June 2011.
- The six regions are: London and the Home Counties/South and South West/Midlands and East Anglia/North/Wales/Scotland and Northern Ireland.

Entry Instructions

Please read carefully

1. NVQ/SVQ/ACA/Diploma/PDA/ICA courses to be Solid or Fibrous Plastering.
2. Student registration numbers to be those confirmed on your books at 31st January 2011.
3. In the event of there being less than five students from any individual College in any of the categories, then in considering that category winner, the Judging Panel may, if it feels appropriate, take other factors into consideration.
4. The Judging Panel may request further information to support your application which must be made available to them or they may seek independent confirmation from the appropriate body.
5. No college will be eligible to receive more than one trophy in any one year.
6. All entries must be accompanied with a print out from your awarding body/bodies verifying registrations/achievements and course type for the set date parameters.
